Dear Chairman Cole and Ranking Member DeLauro:

The 106 undersigned national and state organizations write in support of robust funding for the Statewide Family Engagement Centers grant program and respectfully request no less than its authorized level of \$10 million—in the FY 2017 Labor, Health and Human Services, Education and Related Agencies (L-HHS-ED) appropriations bill.

The Statewide Family Engagement Centers (SFECs) grant program is one of the few non-categorical programs from No Child Left Behind (NCLB) that was maintained in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Both the House of Representatives and the Senate recognized the importance of parent and family engagement in education by including the SFECs program as a standalone program in their respective reauthorization bills. Known as the Parental Information and Resource Centers (PIRCs) under NCLB, the improved SFECs program will build capacity for states and school districts to systematically embed family engagement policies and practices in their education plans. The SFEC program will provide much needed professional development for educators and school leaders to strengthen school-family partnerships and parent-teacher relationships. Additionally, SFECs will provide direct services to families to give them the tools to effectively work with their child's school to improve their child's academic outcomes and overall well-being.

Family engagement has always been, and continuous to be, a bipartisan issue in Congress. In March 2016, <u>22 Senators</u> and <u>38 Representatives</u> from both sides of the aisle signed a Dear Colleague letter in support of funding for Statewide Family Engagement Centers in FY 2017. With ESSA implementation underway, states, school districts, school leaders and parents need programs such as SFECs to engage parents as stakeholders and effectively implement the law as Congress intended.

Research shows that family engagement advances the academic and developmental progress of our nation's children and drives increases in student achievement. Our organizations believe that an investment in SFECs is critical to ensuring that families are meaningfully supported and engaged in their child's education so they can support our nation's students in becoming fully prepared for higher education and careers.

Thank you for your consideration of our request and we look forward to working with you to support this important program.
