## King Springs Elementary School PTA, Georgia

"We are lucky to have a very strong PTA. We average over 500 memberships each year. Having the School of Excellence designation for 2016-2018 definitely impacted the PTA membership participation."

"Absolutely. Our membership increased by 61% (76 members to 122). Our meetings tripled in attendance. More members than ever volunteered. We had functioning committees with a chairperson. Through her efforts, she achieved a whopping 31% increase in membership, resulting in over 140 members."

The increased membership in our PTSA has allowed for better collaboration not only with the administration, but increased involvement in PTA-sponsored and school-related activities by parents, community members and alumni.
