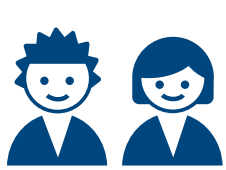

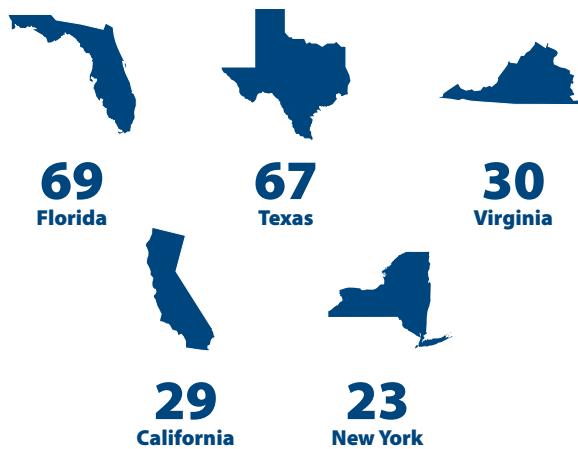

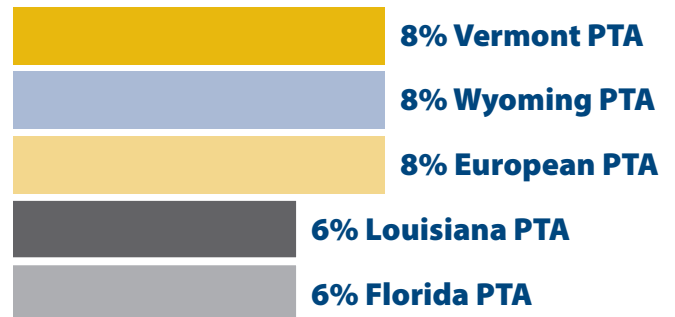

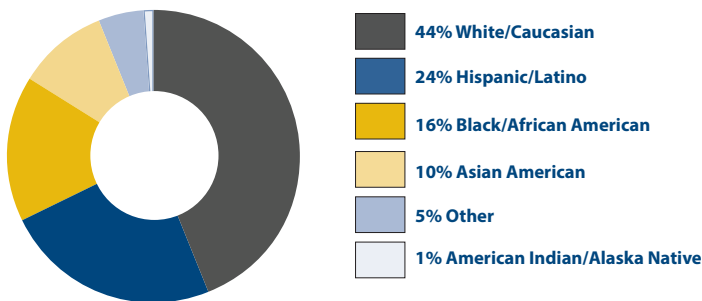
States With the Most Designees



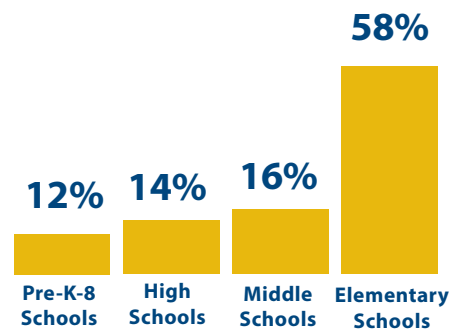
States with the Highest Percentage of Designees

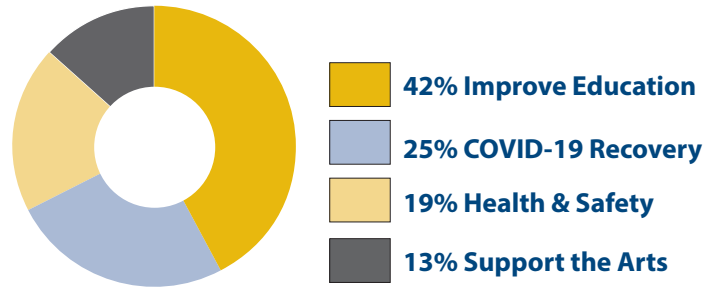
