



## Section 1: Week 3 Activities and Challenges

### Make it Easy to Join

<b>Activity Priority</b> <b>MUST</b> Do MUST activities first, as they are the building blocks to a strong and healthy PTA. <b>SHOULD</b> Look to do SHOULD activities after you complete all or most of the MUST activities. <b>COULD</b> Focus on the COULD activities when you have the capacity to go above and beyond. COULD activities have the potential to take your PTA to the next level.		
Activity/Challenge	Time	Priority
1. Offering an <b>online join</b> option? If your online join is linked to your membership platform or tool, now is the time to use all the tools available to you so, no matter what happens in the fall, you can stay connected to your community.  A. Get the word out! Post the online form link and payment information everywhere—your PTA website, on Facebook, in PTA/PTSA newsletters, email the link out, add to your email signature so it goes to everyone you email!  B. Get the word out beyond your current membership—ask the school to include your online join link in their communications or in the Parent Resources section of their website.  C. If your membership join site offers a communication tool, use it to connect with your members. Post the QR code in 3 places in your community (signs at all your PTA and school events, put it on your social media, on any flyers that are sent home, on signs around the school or even on business cards for your PTA)</p> <p>C.
